

GROUNDS FOR SUSPENSION

Suspension is defined as the temporary removal of a student from the regular school program for a period not to exceed ten school days. A student may be suspended from school by the principal, or designee, for a period not to exceed ten school days. Prior to suspending a student, the principal shall give consideration to the use of alternative measures unless the offense represents a "serious breach of conduct" as defined in School Board Policy and Code of Student Conduct..

Reasons for suspension include, but are not limited to, the following:

- (1) alcohol
- (2) arson
- (3) battery
- (4) bullying / threat
- (5) bus misconduct
- (6) computer / technology misuse
- (7) criminal mischief
- (8) disobedient / insubordinate
- (9) disorderly conduct
- (10) disruptive
- (11) drugs
- (12) fighting
- (13) inappropriate use of electronic devices / cell phones
- (14) left class without permission
- (15) motor vehicle theft
- (16) non-controlled substance
- (17) off-campus – not school related

- (18) parking violation
- (19) profanity
- (20) robbery
- (21) sex offenses / misconduct
- (22) sexual battery
- (23) sexual harassment
- (24) theft
- (25) tobacco / smoking
- (26) trespassing
- (27) vandalism
- (28) weapons possession
- (29) all other expellable offenses
