Come aboard the **Peace River Wilderness Adventure Cruise** as we travel the Peace River, Lettuce Lake, Hunters Creek, and Historic Liverpool. ...Surrealist Paintings and Breathtaking Architecture

– Join us for a visit to **The Dali Museum**. The new museum displays a collection of 96 Dali oil paintings, including eight works that are highlighted by natural light reflected through skylights into alcoves. This is the largest collection and the most comprehensive of the Salvador Dali paintings outside of Spain. The current museum replaces the former by doubling the exhibition space. It is a \$36 million project of glass and concrete. The museum's signature architectural detail is a wave of glass paneling that undulates around the building, designed by Yann Weymouth. AOL Travel News reports it as "one of the top buildings you have to see in your lifetime." We will begin with a docent-led tour through the gardens, followed by a docent-led tour of the museum galleries.

FLORIDA HOLOCAUST MUSEUM

Date: Saturday, February 3, 2018

The Florida Holocaust Museum honors the memory of millions of innocent Jewish and minority men, women, and children who suffered or died in the Holocaust. Exhibits depict the people who lived in Eastern Europe before, during, and after World War II. You will see a rail box car, #113 0695-5 resting on rails from Treblinka. This car carried as many as 100 people to their deaths in the camps. You will see an exhibit of their luggage and shoes. Other areas of the museum tell the story of the Nazi party's rise to power, its hatred and persecution of Jews and minorities, the Holocaust, and the birth of the State of Israel. We will have a 90-minute, docent-led tour followed by time to wander on our own.

Following our visit to the museum, we will stop for lunch (Dutch treat) on the way home.

BABCOCK RANCH ECO-TOURS

...the Real Florida – Discover the heart of Florida on a 92,000-acre working ranch, the Babcock Ranch. The Babcock Family came from Pittsburgh to southwest Florida in 1912 to hunt and fish. They liked the area and bought 100,000 acres of worked-out turpentine woods. When most of the timber was logged out, they converted the acreage to a cattle ranch.

We will climb aboard a swamp buggy for a 90-minute tour through Telegraph Cypress Swamp. You will see four different Florida ecosystems. The ranch is home to White Tailed Deer, Red Shouldered Hawks, Alligators, Florida Panthers, Florida Cracker Cattle, and more.

Following our tour, you may enjoy lunch at the Gator Shack with mouth-watering BBQ pork sandwiches, hot dogs, hamburgers, and more (Dutch treat). You may bring a picnic lunch.

SUNKEN GARDENS, St. Petersburg, Florida

Enjoy the meandering paths, waterfalls, and ponds of Sunken Gardens. It is a luxuriant botanical garden below sea level. It all began in 1903, when George Turner, Sr. purchased a plot of land. There was a four-acre lake on the property. Being an avid gardener, Turner drained the sinkhole and lake and began his below-sea-level garden with citrus trees and a vegetable garden. The garden grew with time. Tropical birds were added in the 1950s. With a lack of tourist interest, the garden was closed in the 1970s. In 1998, St. Petersburg declared the garden a local historic landmark and saved the garden. After years of restoration, Sunken Gardens has re-opened to the public in all its lush and tropical glory. The garden has existed for more than a century and is one of the oldest attractions in the United States. We will enjoy a 90-minute docent-led tour of the garden with time to meander.

Following our visit to the garden and gift shop, we will stop for lunch (Dutch treat) on the way home.

We will be outdoors. Please bring bottled water as well as protection from the weather – jacket (in case of rain), hat, and sunscreen. Closed toe shoes are recommended for safety on uneven paths. Of course, bring your camera.

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
