The museum will exhibit about 400-500 works. Some of Mary James' collection of jewelry from Southwestern artists will reside in a small gallery. Their collection began with Florida artists, but has grown to include Western and Southwestern art. Wildlife art is also included. Their art evokes the spirit of a wide-open frontier and the beauty of life in the wild. In building this splendid home for a part of their vast personal collection of Western and wildlife art, Tom and Mary have succeeded in their aim to share their vision and devotion to art with thousands of visitors. "The Granddaddy of 'Em All" - The Arcadia All-Florida Championship Rodeo is a 4-day event, held in the newly opened \$9 million indoor Mosaic Arena. We have reserved seats with backs (no bleachers) in the first several rows of our section. Before the rodeo begins, you will have time to visit the trade show at the next-door civic center where 50 vendors will offer wares from jewelry to clothing. There will be plenty of food vendors to satisfy your lunch needs. The rodeo will feature an array of events such as bronco riding, calf roping, barrel racing and bull riding. The Arcadia All-Florida Championship Rodeo Association is a volunteer organization that provides annual donations totaling roughly \$60,000 to local groups such as the DeSoto Bard Boosters, Boy Scout Troup 39, the DeSoto 4-H, and Future Farmers

The third level is an open-air deck that provides beautiful views of the passing waterfront. The vessel is complete with restrooms and two full service bars. You will enjoy the Captain's sightseeing narration as we cruise Clearwater Harbor and the Intracoastal Waterway. The luncheon buffet offers a choice of four meats and an assortment of salads and side dishes.

Bok Tower Gardens

In Lake Wales, we will visit Bok Tower Gardens, a National Historic Landmark that is 157 acres of Olmsted-designed landscaped gardens including flowering plants such as azaleas and camellias along with ferns, palms, oaks and pines. The Singing Tower is built on Florida's highest point-elevation 398 feet. It is one of the world's greatest carillons and houses 60 bronze bells with concerts twice daily. The detailed carvings on the 205 foot Singing Tower depict Florida's flora and fauna. Our combine-ticket also includes admission to Pinewood Estate, a Mediterranean mansion, an example of an early Florida winter retreat. A box lunch is included for you to enjoy anywhere on the grounds. (ACE will call you to get your lunch selection.)

The Charles Hosmer Morse Museum of American Art (the Morse Museum)

The Morse Museum located in Winter Park, Florida, houses the world's most comprehensive collection of works by Louis Comfort Tiffany (1848-1933), including the artist and designer's jewelry, pottery, paintings, art glass, leaded glass lamps and windows. See his award-winning chapel interior from the 1893 World's Columbian Exposition in Chicago; and art and architectural objects from his Long Island country estate, Laurelton Hall. The Museum's holdings also include American art pottery, late 19th and early 20th century American paintings, graphics, and decorative art. We will stop for a Dutch-treat lunch along the way.
