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### **Health Spotlight**

The LNS Health Office wants to warn parents about the following summer health hazards:

#### **Extreme Heat:**

When it's hot, it's not just uncomfortable. It can make you sick. Take special care with children and the elderly, because their bodies don't cool as well. Wear loose clothes, don't exercise at the hottest part of the day, and stay hydrated. Symptoms of heat-related illness may include cramps, nausea, and pale moist skin. Go to a cooler place, drink fluids, and put cool cloths on the skin. If you are not getting better or if you have more serious symptoms such as high fever, fast heart rate, warm and dry skin, confusion, change in behavior, or convulsions, call 911.

#### **Sunburn:**

Always wear sunscreen. Avoid the sun's strongest rays during the middle of the day. Wear clothes that protect your arms and legs, and a hat that shields your face, ears and neck. Reapply sunscreen every 3 hours, or more often if you get sweaty or swim. (There is no such thing as water/roof sunscreen.) Remember, even a tan is sun damage.

### **West Nile Virus:**

Mosquitoes are more than a bother. They can spread West Nile virus. Most people who get the virus have no symptoms at all. But very serious and sometimes fatal illness can happen in less than 1% of those infected. The only way to avoid West Nile is to avoid mosquito bites. Wear mosquito repellent and, if weather permits, long pants and long sleeves outside from dusk to dawn. At home, get rid of standing water in birdbaths, buckets and the swings. They're breeding grounds for mosquitoes.

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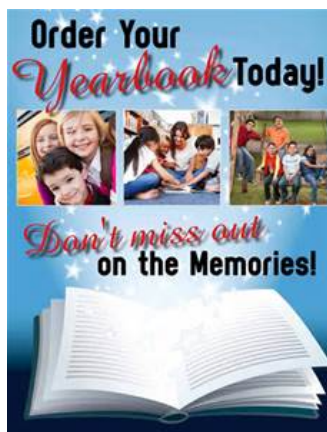


### **Agency Fair & Parent Workshops**

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### The Buddy Bench Project

This year one of the LNS Teachers requested that the PTO consider installing a Buddy Bench on the playground at Laurel Nokomis.

What is a Buddy Bench you may ask. Well it's recess! Kids are screaming and balls are flying. However some kids aren't joining in on the fun. The simple concept behind this bench has been adopted by educators around the world. Basically, when a student feels lonely, they know to go over and sit on the buddy bench. This lets other kids know that they are looking for a friend. Someone will come over and ask them to play. Kids learn that they should always remember to glance over at the school's Buddy Bench to invite new friends to join in on the fun. Buddy Benches help to eliminate loneliness on the playground and enable kids to keep growing their circle of friends until everyone has someone to play with.

One of the 7th Graders at the school named Zoe W. heard about this request and decided to work on this project to earn a Silver Award in Girl Scouts. The Silver



award is the second highest award a Girl Scout can earn and the highest award a Girl Scout Cadette can earn. Zoe is committed to making and installing at least one Buddy Bench on the Playground and hopes to make more over the summer so that they can be installed at LNS before the next school year. She plans on working with her girl scout troop (Troop 539) to make a YouTube Video to tell the elementary students about the Buddy Bench and how it is used.

Zoe says that she wants to use Cedar Wood to build the benches because it is durable outside and is resistant to insects, rot and splinters. It is also a lightweight wood so you can move it where you want it to be. She plans on using stainless steel hardware to prevent rusting. Zoe is putting a lot of thought into this project and looks forward to seeing Buddy Benches on the playground and knowing that they will be creating great new friendships here at the school. 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### **SCHOOL DISTRICT NEWS: New School Calendar**

See the proposed calendars for 2017-18 and 2018-19 at this [link](#).

The committee recommended that school in Sarasota County start Monday, Aug. 14, 2017, and end Thursday, May 24, 2018. The following school year, the start day would be Monday, Aug. 13, 2018, and the last day of school would be Friday, May 24, 2019. In both years, the earlier start date would mean that first semesters and related exams at high schools will be completed before the winter break. The schedule for both years also would end the school year before the Memorial Day weekend.

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### **New This Year: Online Re-registration via InfoSnap**

The Sarasota County School recently announced a new online Student Re-Registration for the upcoming school year! This process replaces the paper forms sent home at the beginning of each school year. No more writers cramps or lost paperwork. No more guessing about what paperwork or documentation is needed.

In addition, required documentation can be submitted online during the InfoSnap registration session or may be turned in to the Laurel Nokomis School Front Office. Please know that students can **not** be registered until all required documentation has been received.

Opening in March for the 2017/2018 school year, each student will be issued a "Snapcode". The code was sent via e-mail and/or in a letter from INFOSNAP. This code is the key to beginning your paperless journey to reregistration. Snapcodes are generated and sent directly by the school district. For security reasons, you will need to contact the school directly for the student's snapcode if you don't receive one via email or mail.

1. Be sure to sign up for the Parent Portal first!\*
2. Click this snapcode link you receive via email or mail.
3. If you've never completed an online Student Re-Registration with InfoSnap, you should create an InfoSnap Account. This allows you to securely save your work and come back at a later time if necessary. You can use your email address or cell phone number. If you already have an account, you can sign in and complete the form. (You should use the same account to complete forms for multiple children.)
4. Questions marked with a red asterisk (\*) are required.
5. When you have finished entering your information, click "Submit." This will send all of the information you've entered to the school. If you cannot click on this button, you will need to make sure that you have answered all required questions.

If you have more than one student in the district, you will need to do this for each child because you'll need to provide information that is specific for each child. Submit one Student Re-Registration and then start another - this will allow you to "snap over" shared family information, which will save you time.

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### Preparing for the FSA

Here are some tips for preparing your child for the FSA put together by the guidance office at one of the Sarasota School District Elementary Schools:

1. Encourage your child to do his/her best!
2. Prevent Test Anxiety Some people feel anxious or worry about tests. Some forms of test anxiety include feeling nervous, upset stomach, not being able to concentrate, negative thoughts and having difficulty remembering facts. Some strategies for dealing with test anxiety are listed below.
3. Think positively! Researchers have found that when students believe they will do well, their scores go up. If you start to have negative or bad thoughts about yourself, think about something positive, like the times when you have done well at a hard task. Or, reframe the thought into a positive thought, I know this is hard but I can do it or all that is important is that I do my best.
4. Practice relaxation techniques before the test  
Belly Breathing ... Breathe in as much air as possible through your nose holding the tip of your tongue on the roof of your mouth until your lungs are full while holding your breath (3-5 seconds), lower your tongue and exhale slowly through your mouth. Repeat several times.  
Mindfulness exercise... Close your eyes, think about relaxing your toes, then your feet, then your ankles and work your way slowly up to the top of your head. Listen to your breathing as you slowly and deliberately inhale and exhale. Listen to the sounds around you.
5. Pacing and Timing Techniques - Good test takers learn to manage their time well.
  - Don't waste time. Skip questions that you are unsure of, go back to them at the end of the test.
  - Read the directions, questions and answers carefully. Keep track of time.
6. Take care of the basics:
  - Eat a balanced breakfast.
  - See that your child gets the recommended amount of sleep; for elementary aged students (10- 11) hours per night.
